GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

HAA JOURNAL publishes brief notices of new geographic distributions of reptiles and amphibians on the African continent and adjacent islands, including Madagascar and the Mascarene Islands.

A standard format (similar to that used in Herpetological Review by SSAR) is to be used, as follows:

SCIENTIFIC NAME: COMMON NAME; LOCALITY (country, province or state, location, quater degree grid square — use metric distances); DATE (day, month, year); COLLECTOR(S); PLACE OF DEPOSITION AND CATALOGUE NUMBER (Required); COMMENTS; REFERENCES; SUBMITTED BY (Name and address).

Observation records are not acceptable. Records submitted should be based on preserved specimens deposited in a university, museum, or nature conservation department collection (private collection records will be accepted only in exceptional circumstances).
